The Castle

Built around 1060 by William the Conqueror, this vast fortress – one of the largest in Europe – still bears witness to every century of history since the great epic of its founder. After two years of restoration, the site has been transformed with a new visitor pavilion, landscaped gardens and an interpretation trail.

The Abbeys

Caen's twin abbeys are true masterpieces of Norman Romanesque art and lasting symbols of William the Conqueror and Queen Matilda, who are each laid to rest within their walls. The churches date back to the 11th century, while the convent buildings were remodelled in the 18th. Remarkably spared during the Second World War, the abbeys remain powerful witnesses to Caen's history.

The price includes:

The guided tour of the castle and of one of the abbeys of your choice, lunch including a 3-course menu and a drink packages (1/4 wine, coffee), the commentary tour aboard the little train. Caen

Over the centuries, the city has been marked by major historical events: from William the Conqueror, whose legacy is none other than Caen's three landmark sites (i.e. the castle and the two abbeys), to the Battle of Normandy, which left the city scarred, luckily sparing a few Mddle-ages and Renaissance gems.

The Caen Memorial Museum

An immersion into the heart of 20th century history. A century marked by World War II, a conflict that claimed 60 million civilian and military victims. A century of profound geopolitical upheaval marked by Europe's ambition to preserve peace.

The exhibits: World War II, the Normandy landings and the Battle of Normandy, General Richter's underground bunker, Europe: our history, the Cold War.

This price includes: Guided tour of Caen and the Caen Memorial Museum (two guides or an audio guide), admission to the Abbaye aux Hommes and the Caen Memorial Museum, and lunch (three courses + ¼ wine, coffee). Seafront Villas

The Caen la mer coastline is shared between 4 resorts with 10km of fine sandy beaches. Beautiful villas in the eclectic architectural style so typical of the Normandy coastline line the beach and invite you to take a stroll.

Sea cruise

Step aboard for a guided boat trip between Ouistreham and Luc-sur-Mer. From the water, you'll discover the history of the D-Day Landings, admire Sword Beach from a whole new angle, and hear the stories behind the coastline's grand villas and its unique architectural heritage.

Along the way, learn about local fishing, the diversity of marine species, and the beauty – as well as the fragility – of this marine environment, all while enjoying the calm and the distinctive light of the Côte de Nacre. An outing that is both enlightening and wonderfully refreshing.

A day trip in Normandy to historical must-see sites...

Caen Memorial

The museum helps you experience the history of the 20th century, from the origins of the Second World War to the end of the Cold War. A large space is dedicated to D-Day and the Battle of Normandy.

OR

Arromanches Museum

This was the first museum opened on the D-Day theme after the Second World War. It shows how Mulberry B Harbour was built, while the remains of the real harbour can still be seen just outside the museum. The museum moved into a new building in 2023.

The Normandy Landings beaches

This is a chance to see the main sites where the fate of the country played out on 6 June 1944: the Mulberry Harbour in Arromanches, the German battery in Longues-sur-Mer, the US cemetery in Colleville-sur-Mer* and Omaha Beach.

 \star Advance booking is now mandatory for entry to the American Cemetery, and visitors must arrive at the reserved time slot. Failure to do so may result in access being denied.

This price includes:

Guided tour of the Caen Memorial Museum (two guides or an audio guide) or of the Arromanches Museum, guided tour on the landing beaches, admission to Caen Memorial Museum or to the Arromanches Museum, and lunch (three courses + 1/4 wine, coffee). The price does not include:

Coach travel, personal expenses, extra drinks and any extras not on the menu, as well as any other service not listed on this programme. Please note:

DDAY OFF THE BEATEN TRACK

Just a stone's throw from Caen, discover the D-Day Landing Beaches from a new perspective!

Sword Beach

This was one of the five iconic D-Day beaches, where 177 French soldiers from the Kieffer commando unit landed.

The British cemetery in Hermanville-sur-Mer

1,005 Allied soldiers are buried in the British cemetery. Most of the soldiers died on 6 June or on the days following the D-Day landings.

The Hillman site

The 24-hectare site with 18 bunkers and underground structures was built by the Germans between 1942 and 1944. It was the command post for their coastal defences on the Côte de Nacre.

The Grand Bunker

The Atlantic Wall Museum is housed in the former headquarters of the German army commanding the batteries in the Orne estuary. The tower was made from 5,000 tons of concrete and steel, and was unique in its kind. Standing 17 metres high and with 6 storeys, it looked down on the villas in Riva-Bella. It has been restored to show how it looked before 6 June 1944.

The commentary cruise will take you into the Seine estuary and underneath the impressive Pont de Normandie bridge.
